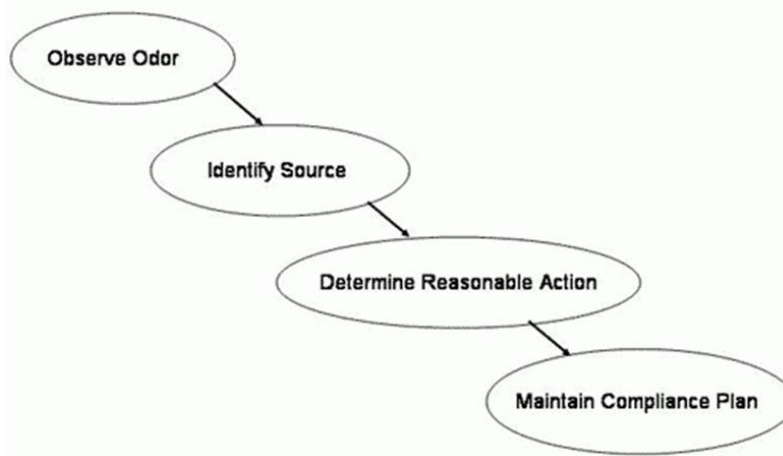




ODOR EVENT RECORDING FORM

Odor complaints are handled on the county level, since there is no state odor rule. The first thing to do is identify where the odor is coming from. The figure below illustrates a common path. It is not necessarily the only way to address odor concerns, but the figure identifies main process that need to be considered.
